My Dear People

We continue reading from the sixth chapter of John’s Gospel. After the feeding of the five thousand, when the people tried to make him king, Jesus withdrew to the hills. People did not know where Jesus had gone. The next day they find him and they ask Him when he had arrived in there, perhaps it was Capernaum.

However Jesus does not answer their question about the time of his arrival, but rather talks to them about why they seek him and that they are seeking him for the wrong reason Him.

It is interesting to note how the people addressed Jesus when they found him. They said to him ‘Rabbi’ meaning teacher. It seems they had forgotten how they proclaimed him as a prophet the previous day.

Miracles in the Gospel of John are ‘signs’ of his power and of his authority. Those who were witnesses for these events believed in him. But the people who witnessed the feeding of the five thousand have not come to believe in Him.

That’s why Jesus tells them that they looked for him only because their stomachs were satisfied.

Jesus tells them not to look or work for the food that perishes but to work for food that endures for eternal life.

As we hear the gospel text today, firstly, it is an invitation for us to ask ourselves what our reasons are as we look for Jesus?

In the aftermath of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves, a long conversations begins between Jesus and the people, so that Jesus could lead them to a deeper understanding of himself as the ‘Bread of Life’. There is a similarity of the conversation of Jesus with the Samaritan woman at the well. Gradually He brought her to an understanding of Him as the ‘Living Water’.

Secondly we too are invited to approach this encounter in a similar way, so that we too believe that Jesus is the Bread of Life, God’s life giving gift to all of us.

Eighteenth Sunday of the Year - (Year B)

Scripture Insights

Alongside John 6 and the discourse on the bread of life, the Church hears most of the fourth and fifth chapters of Paul’s letter to the Ephesians. Known as one of the captivity letters because it is apparently written from prison, the Letter to the Ephesians discusses the mystery of life in Christ. Paul’s exhortation to “live in a manner worthy of the call you have received,” which we heard last week, strikes at the heart of Christian discipleship. This week, Paul continues to call the Ephesians to a renewal in Christ—to “put away the old self of your former way of life...and be renewed in the spirit of your minds”. It was expected that Baptism into death and Resurrection of Christ would bring radical life changes for early Christians. For some, this meant giving up jobs and wealth; for others, it meant hospitality or service. For everyone, life in Christ was lived according to God and not according to the world. Christians were encouraged to embrace love rather than ambition, greed, or power and to focus on the treasure of heaven rather than on earthly wealth.

Consequently, this small section of the Letter to the Ephesians provides the perfect prelude to the discourse on the bread of life in John’s account of the Gospel. Jesus warns the crowd that they are thinking wrongly—running to see him for perishable bread. In Paul’s vocabulary, the crowd sees Jesus with old eyes, with their old selves. If they saw Jesus with spiritual eyes, they

would know him as the Bread of Life. They would seek only the bread of life. They would hear Jesus’ gentle correction to their assertion that Moses gave them manna from heaven. “My Father gives you the true bread from heaven”. Physical hunger and thirst made the Jews rely on God in the desert. Jesus shows the crowd that hunger has much deeper implications for the soul. If they believe Christ is food and drink, they will never be hungry or thirsty.

Thoughts for Reflection

- Through Christ, we are able to put away that which is not of Christ. In him, we choose holy lives that are earmarked by kindness, love, and charity. In this life, we are fed and nourished by Christ himself, present in the Eucharist.
- In the desert, God provided the Israelites with manna that sustained their lives throughout their years in the desert following the exodus from Egypt.
- In the Gospel reading, Jesus references the manna and begins explaining the bread of life that has come from heaven.
- When we receive the Eucharist, we are consuming the bread that is Christ, and our spiritual hunger is filled.

Celebration of Mass:

At St Stephen's, we will continue to celebrate Mass socially distanced and face coverings are to be worn. Hand sanitisers should be used entering and leaving church and the 'one-way' in and out system will be in use. As long as the *NHS Test, Track and Trace* system is in operation, we will continue to make available the means for people to sign in when attending Mass using the NHS app and scanning the QR code *or* completing a *Track & Trace* card. It will be kept secure and will be destroyed 21 days after the Mass you have attended. A copy of the card is attached to this newsletter which you can print and complete at home to bring with you when you come to Mass. One card per individual or household group. Cards will be available in the porch at each Mass (please bring your own pen) and must be completed. *Please note a card is required to be completed for each Mass you attend.* There will be no toilet facilities open in church or the hall.

We ask everyone to respect and follow the guidance for the celebration of Mass in our church and for your cooperation and understanding so we can keep the church a safe environment for all. Many thanks to all our stewards.

Guidance for the Celebration of Mass.

This guidance has been issued by the Bishops Conference of England and Wales for the celebration of Mass.

On 19th July, the current legislative powers which assist the mitigations against the covid-19 virus transmission will be rescinded by HM Government. Even without this legislation in place, the Church in England and Wales will be adopting a cautious approach to capacity and activity within our churches. All places of worship will have to consider the prevailing local conditions for the virus. Special consideration is to be given to rates at which people are being vaccinated in the locality, the prevalence of new variants of the virus, the local rates of hospital admissions and any local public health advice.

The Communion Rite:

The priest shows to the congregation the Host and says audibly – “The Body of Christ” and the “Blood of Christ” – and the people respond –Amen. The priest will receive Holy Communion under both kinds using his own Host and Chalice. The priest will hold a reverent silence before the Prayer after Communion, giving the Blessing and dismissal. As the people have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord, at the Priest's Communion, the distribution to the congregation of Holy Communion will be in silence with no dialogue between minister and communicant. Communion must be given in the hand only, with the communicant standing, avoiding any physical contact. People should wait in their pews until instructed to move forward in an orderly manner pew by pew by the steward, aware of the social distancing. Once you have received communion please leave the church via the side door (through the small hall) as directed by the steward. Do not return to the pew. Please use the hand sanitiser. At the end of the celebration the priest should return to the Sacristy. The Church should be closed immediately after Mass in order to clean the space and parishioners encouraged to return home.

Catholic Voices Pandemic Survey - Catholic Voices was involved in a very successful survey and report during the first lockdown in May-July 2020. Over 2,500 Catholics in England and Wales and Scotland were surveyed, which has given us important insights into how people responded to the arrival of the pandemic. Since then a lot has changed and *Catholic Voices* would like to hear again from people about their current experiences and, crucially, what they feel about that future, so the survey is being relaunched. Donations to St Stephen's Church: Online, Contactless and Chip & Pin

In an increasingly cashless society, we are able to respond to new ways in which people can donate to St Stephen's.

We are pleased to announce that we have installed 2 **Digital Collection Plates** situated at the back of the church which parishioners can use whenever you come into church. Making a donation is simple and quick. Press one of the donation values e.g. £5, £10, £15, £20, £50 or Other Amount. Tap your card or phone on the card reader. For donations greater than £45, the card must be inserted at the top of the card reader with the chip facing downwards, enter your pin number and press the green arrow to confirm your donation. After tapping / inserting your card, the card reader will beep, and a blue light will show up, and screen will read payment approved. Your donation can be gift aided. The donor can complete a digital Gift Aid Declaration on the Digital Collection Plate screen and all future donations you make using this card will automatically be recorded—online and/ or in church. A Gift Aid Declaration is required when using the Digital Collection Plate for the first time even if you are registered for Gift Aid at St Stephen's. Once you have registered for Gift Aid you will receive a 'thank you' email with a copy of your Gift Aid Declaration.

You will also be able to contribute to 2nd Collections. Just choose the fund you wish to donate to and the amount you wish to donate.

Making a donation here is also simple and quick. Enter the amount you would like to give and enter your card details. If you would like to gift aid your donation please click on the 'yes' button and enter your name, address and email address. Any future donations you make using this card online or in church will also be gift aided (if eligible).

Reminder: To enable the church to claim the gift aid on your donation when using your debit / credit card (online or in church) you must register by entering your name, address and email address. Once registered, all future online and in church

card payments will be gift aided (as long as you use the same payment card). *A suggestion to save you time in church* – you can make a small donation online (eg £1) and register your details so that when you tap your card in church you are already registered and therefore do not have to enter your details again. If you do not have an email address but would like to use the contactless / online donation device please contact the church office.

Mass Offering - If you wish to use the envelope for a Mass Offering, please do not tick a box but write the intention or name of the person on the lines provided so we can clearly identify the intent of your gift.

The Archbishop's Certificate (ArchCert) is an online course for all in Southwark who wish to know their Catholic faith more deeply and to develop the skills to share this faith with others. The certificate is in accord with Archbishop John Wilson's vision for a missionary diocese and is open to all who work towards this in our diocese whether in parishes, chaplaincy work, schools and in their families. We encourage those who volunteer in the parish to speak to Canon Edward about participation on the Archbishop's Certificate.

Participants will take a two-year journey through the Church's teaching to understand their faith in a more profound way and be able to share it with both confidence and joy. Students are supported with 9 online study sessions throughout the course, together with a tutor who will accompany them for the duration of the course and also with attendance at three study days (on Saturdays) at the Amigo Hall, St George's Cathedral, in Southwark. The study days combine a balance of teaching, liturgy, social time and prayer.

The course will commence in October 2021 and the cost will be £365 per year. Registration must be completed in advance.
