My dear people

Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means rejoice in Latin and it comes from the Entrance Antiphon for today's Mass, taken from the letter of St. Paul to Philippians. Usually on this day we find the presiding priest wearing rose-coloured vestments instead of violet or purple. This practice of wearing rose-coloured vestments came about in the 12th—13th centuries.

During the Middle Ages Advent was kept as a kind of a 'mini' season of Lent in preparation for the celebration of Christmas. Just as fourth Sunday of Lent, known as Laetare Sunday, to relax the Lenten observances, Gaudete Sunday was a moment of a greater joyful anticipation as we near Christmas. This joyful anticipation is proclaimed and sung aloud this weekend as we pray, 'Rejoice in the Lord always, and again we say rejoice.'

Just as we met John the Baptist on the second Sunday of Advent, we meet him once again on the third Sunday of Advent. Having met John the Baptist in chapter 3, today we meet him again in chapter 11, and he is in prison. The reasons for his imprisonment we read in chapter 14.

The mission of John the Baptist ends with his imprisonment and death. His trials seem to be both physical and mental, and also it seems he has lost his former confidence that Jesus is the one who was to come. Jesus, the one whose mission he has prepared, has not preached the Kingdom in the way John expected. But Jesus reassures him by describing his mission in terms that John would recognise from the prophets.

Jesus' answer to John's messengers is that his deeds can speak for themselves. John has witnessed to Jesus and now Jesus witnesses to John the Baptist.

As the days grow shorter and colder, as we wait in joyful hope, the readings invite us to think of new life. Where in our lives do we need to experience the newness as we journey towards the feast of Christmas?

# Third Sunday in Advent (Year A)

# **Scripture Insights**

Feeding the hungry, releasing those held captive, giving sight to the blind, raising up those who are bowed down: these are the marks of the kingdom because they are God's activities. It's easy to read them merely as spiritual metaphors, but the material and the spiritual always intertwine in Scripture. God (and Jesus) feeds those who hunger for bread and those who hunger for God.

Although Jesus' ministry ushered in the dawning of God's kingdom and a new end of exile for all people, we are still waiting, here in this season of Advent. James writes to his fellow Christians to tell them to be patient as they await the coming of the Lord. Be patient, he repeats. He uses as his examples the farmer and the prophet. The farmer waits patiently for months to see how her seeds will grow; the prophets waited through decades of loss and suffering before seeing the glory of the Lord arriving to save them. Indeed, the prophet Isaiah is like a farmer, for he announces the salvation of God with flowers that bloom in the desert.

### Reflections

• When the disciples of John the Baptist asked Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" they probably hoped for a yes or no answer (Mt 11:3). While their question was pretty straightforward, Jesus' response is not so easily understood. Instead, Jesus invites John's disciples to reflect on the things that they have seen and heard.

• On this Third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate Gaudate Sunday, a day of great rejoicing. Now more than halfway through Advent we take a moment to celebrate and rejoice in what we have seen and heard. Like John's disciples, we have experienced the incredible works of the Lord. We see and hear dozens of instances of joy, comfort, health, and well-being every day. The Lord is no longer just coming soon. The Lord is close at hand! We have many reasons to rejoice!

#### **Introduction to Mass**

We rejoice with all our hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand. Let us prepare the way for his coming by examining our lives and asking the Lord to restore us to right relationship with him.

## **Liturgy and Life**

When we start the season singing, "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord," we have to give ourselves the space and ability to do so. When we hear the words of the Third Sunday of Advent ("The blind receive their sight, the lame will walk, the lepers are cleansed . . . "), we need to ask ourselves if we have opened our eyes to the needs of those around us. Take this time to come into a deeper relationship with God through prayer and service. The hopeful result: rejoicing in our renewed spirituality as we celebrate the birth of Jesus!
